## The True Meaning of Giving Often Comes from Unexpected Places

This month, OCS met an extraordinary person - Timothy. Timothy, 14, and his parents contacted Mtr. Laurie to help with our Gloversville High School outreach project of putting together bags of hygiene and personal care items. Timothy remembered Mtr. Laurie from her visit to HFM PTECH in the fall when she wore her ridiculous space suit to help kick off the PTECH food drive. He started following the OCS Facebook page and when this opportunity popped up, Timothy and his family were on board.

On March 2, Timothy's parents drove him all the way from Mayfield so he could bring 7 packed bags with supplies, 2 of them made by his grandma who had never donated anywhere before, because she wasn't in the position to do it. But she and Timothy made 7 bags for 7 students and their families.

But he did something else, too. He brought hats for us to give away at NOAH and the Food Pantry — hats that he made in sparkly red and blue, in the colors of sports teams, and some of them in one solid color. These hats are made in memory of his grandfather who passed away last May in 2023.

He didn't stop there. On March 27, Timothy created the video below for OCS because he is convinced that our community needs this program. We were both touched and inspired by Timothy's hard work, and would like to share it more widely. Remember that this is Timothy's work and his video. The title? "Be Selfless" Timothy studied our information and turned it into useful and sometimes astonishing statistics (It would take 13.9 years to make as many dinners as NOAH served in a year!!) Timothy's commitment is our commitment — to nourish our neighbor in body, mind and spirit. Thanks Timothy. You keep impressing us!

When we're tempted to think that the world is not going in the right direction, or if we start to think that maybe a space suit on a minister is over the top, or even if we think that when somebody dies, there is nothing we can do to keep their memory alive — Timothy and his family

remind us that the generosity we share really, really, really does change the world.

permanent, 100% asbestos free flooring in the building! Step by step, project by project, we move closer to our late spring opening!








A \$100,000 challenge is being offered by the Brown Family in honor of Dee and Dick Brown to help us leap into our move to One Church Street!
